An Episcopal priest and friend whose parish is in New York City posted a story earlier this month on social media that reflects the vigilance I, and perhaps you, have been feeling of late. Julie was coming out of the subway when she saw two officers, not in any identifiable uniform, pull aside a young Latino who, as far as she could tell, had done nothing wrong. She pulled out her phone and watched and recorded as the officers spoke with him. As others were exiting the subway, they noticed her and what she was paying attention to, and two others joined her in bearing witness to the possibility that they might need to rally around the young gentleman. Many minutes passed, as they readied themselves to do whatever they legally could to protect the man's rights.

Eventually the officers, transit police it turned out, wrote the man a ticket and sent him on his way. Relieved that the young man was not going to be detained by ICE, the three who had been keeping watch turned to each other and said "Thank God for community! This is what it's for!" Theirs was a brief moment, Julie wrote, of both terror and beauty – of racial profiling, and bystanders ready to be upstanders.

Keeping watch, staying awake. Being vigilant, ready, prepared to witness, and to be Christ in the world. These are, of course, well-known themes in the season of Advent.

Yet I am especially struck by Julie's turn of phrase "bystanders ready to be upstanders" because to be upstanding is also an expectation of Advent.

*Upstanding – meaning of good character, honest and honorable, morally centered and ethical in decision-making, and courageous enough confront what is wrong or unjust – is no longer a word widely used in our culture. In our society that values high achievement, we tend to favor outstanding over upstanding to describe people we admire. I do remember as a child, however, older generations in my family using the word. "He's such an upstanding young man," they might say. If I were to start looking for it in the historic cemeteries and churches of Dutchess County, I might see upstanding carved in stone in loving memory.*

The sacred texts and hymns of Advent and Christmas, include rich imagery of an expectation for us all, in Christ, to be Upstanders.

Sleepers, wake! A voice astounds us. The shout of rampart guards surrounds us:  
Awake, Jerusalem, **arise!**

Hark! a thrilling voice is sounding, "Christ is nigh" it seems to say.  
Wakened by the solemn warning, from earth's bondage let us **rise.**

**Arise**, shine, for your light has come,  
and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you.

There are many theologies about why God chose to be born into the human condition, yet one meaning of the Incarnation might be this: By the life, teaching, and sacrifice of Jesus, God is showing us how to be our best selves, our authentic selves, which is to be *upstanding*. Then, by the Spirit granted to us, God makes it possible for us to be so.

In the key story of Jesus healing a paralytic, saying, “Get up, take up your bed and walk,” we are told the man’s healing is both physical and spiritual. His sins are forgiven, and Jesus tells him to be *awake* (Get up) and *upstanding* (walk). In this healing moment, Jesus could have just as easily said, “Arise, shine.”

When God comes into the world, bringing healing and ushering in salvation, God with us makes it possible for each and every one of us to be *upstanding*, to walk with integrity and kindness, to rise to every occasion of need, to witness to injustice and be ever ready to protect others from harm. Christ comes so that we might once again be whom God created us to be, in God’s own image and very good. In the season of Advent, let this be our hope, and when Christmastide arrives, our confidence and joy. Amen. Come, O Jesus!




The book has now won 2 National First Place awards!! Congratulations Naomi!
